ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE OF THE SECOND YEAR BSCSM STUDENTS AT
JBLFMU-MOLO

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(Methods of Research)

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Abstract

This descriptive study, conducted last October 2007, aimed to determine the academic performance of the second year Bachelor of Science in Cruise Ship Management students of John B. Lacson Foundation Maritime University - Molo (JBLFMU-Molo) for S.Y. 2007-2008. It also aimed to determine if there were significant differences in academic performance among respondents when classified according to sex, high school of origin, monthly income of the family and parents' educational attainment. The respondents were the 141 randomly selected BSCSM second year students of JBLFMU-Molo. A researcher made questionnaire was used to determine level of academic performance of the BSCSM students of JBLFMU-Molo. The statistical tools used were the mean, standard deviation, t-test, and one-way analysis of variance. One of the major findings of this research

[showed that the BSCSM students' level of academic performance is "good" and that no significant difference exists on the level of academic performance when based on sex, family income, parents' educational background, and high school of origin.]
