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*Abstract*

This study was conducted to determine the behavior and academic performance of the BSCA students. The 97 respondents were selected through simple random sampling. A modified questionnaire was used to gather the data. The data gathered were subjected to both descriptive and inferential statistics. The results of the inferential statistics were interpreted at 0.05 alpha level. The study revealed that the behavior of the BSCA students when taken as a whole and when classified according to place of residence, high school of origin and age is extrovert. The level of academic performance of introverts is high, and so is the level of academic performance of extroverts. The t-tests revealed that there is no significant difference in the behavior of the students when they are classified according to place of residence, high school of origin and age. No significant relationship exists between the behavior and the level of academic performance of the BSCA students.
