Abstract

This descriptive research focused on the JBLFMU Training
Center students who took the Basic Training course,
specifically those who graduate from Cruise Ship
Management. Sources of data were thirty Cruise Ship
Management students who finished their BST course and were
classified as to their age and gender. Sampling method used
was the accidental random sampling. Means and standard
deviations were the descriptive statistics used.
Inferential statistics used was Spearman rho set at .05
alpha level. The study found out generally CSM students had
a positive attitude towards BST course when taken as an
