Abstract

This study aimed to determine the views of students for attending and for not attending the flag ceremony. The data were obtained using the data gathering instrument developed by the researchers. The results were presented through the descriptive discussion and corresponding interpretation. Descriptive statistics used were the frequency count, percentage and rank. The result revealed that when taken as an entire group, out of 851 respondents, 68.27 percent were attending and 31.73 percent were not attending the flag ceremony. When grouped according to sex, data showed 76.42 percent of male were attending and 64.07 percent were not attending, while 23.58 percent of the female respondents were attending and 35.93 percent were not attending. When grouped according to year level data showed that most numbered attending were the first year students with 48.36

percent while the second year have the most numbered of students who were not attending the flag ceremony with 35.19 percent. Moreover, when group according to course data showed that BSMAR-E students were the most numbered attending with 72.29 percent while the BSCA have the most numbered of students who were not attending with 8.15 percent.
