## Abstract

This descriptive research study determined the level of awareness on the perceived difficulties of women working onboard among female CSM students of John B. Lacson Foundation Maritime University-Molo, Inc. This study, conducted last October 2009, utilized the 295 purposively selected female BSCSM students. A researcher-made questionnaire-checklist was used as the data gathering instrument. Descriptive statistics used were the mean and standard deviation. Results revealed that when taken as an entire group, the level of awareness was found to have an "average" level. When classified according to year level, the first year was found to have an "average" level of awareness. The second year was found to have an "average" level of awareness and the third year was found to have a "high" level of awareness.
