Abstract

The study mainly aimed at determining the level of management among freight forwarders in Iloilo City for the year 2006.

There were 56 respondents used in this research study. The data was gathered through the use of a questionnaire adopted from the study of Dr. Jaleco (1994). Frequency and mean were used in this descriptive type of research.

The results revealed that when taken as an entire group, the level of management among freight forwarders in Iloilo City was "very satisfactory" and when grouped according to number of workers, small and large companies in terms of asset size, partnership and corporation type of ownership. While medium companies and single ownerships were perceived to have "satisfactory" level of management.
