ABSTRACT

The study determined the perception of students on the modular approach of Filipino 1 as a subject. The perception of the modular approach in Filipino 1 of the 175 first year BS CSM students when taken as an entire group was "effective". The responses of the first year BS CSM students who belonged to the following categories; female (M= 3.31; SD .69) male (M=3.23; SD.74); rural (M=3.19; SD .78) urban (M=3.39; SD .60); private (M=3.43; SD .65) public (M=3.23; SD .72); excellent (M=3.21; SD .69) very satisfactory (M=3.24; SD .69) satisfactory (M=3.29; SD .74) and poor (M=3.63; SD .63), were effective. The narrow dispersion of the means, as evidenced by the standard deviation of .60 and .78 indicates the homogeneity of perception among the 175 first year BS CSM students on the modular approach in Filipino 1.
