Abstract

This descriptive study was conducted to find out the perceived benefits of navigational trip among third year BS Cruise Ship Management students at JBLCF-Molo, Inc.. The participants were the 133 randomly selected third year students of the Business Department enrolled during the school year 2006-2007. The data needed for the study were obtained by the use of a researcher-made instrument adopted from Ricofuerto, F.B. Descriptive statistics used were frequency counts and ranking. Results of the study showed that the following were the dominant personal benefits derived from navigational trip: helps me overcome seasickness, learn the culture of others, develop self-confidence, perform tasks which are new to me, have a

better understanding of my strengths and weaknesses, develop self-esteem, improve communication skills; while develop initiative, develop creativeness, and I feel I am fitted to engage in this profession are the least dominant personal reasons; in terms of educational benefits, develop human relations, develop my capability of practicing my profession, acquire sufficient knowledge of ship management and orientation, prove my worth as a good worker, helps us perform our job efficiently, and learn to manage time are the most dominant; while be familiar with the tools and equipment of the ship, be familiar with the parts of the ship and be of service to others, and acquire knowledge of marine ecology are the least dominant.
