Abstract

This study was conducted to determine the level of awareness of the John B. Lacson Foundation Maritime University- Molo students in the school developments and the level of the perceived effects to them. It involved two hundred forty eight (248) randomly selected students of the College of Business of the University. The descriptive type of research was used. It utilized a questionnaire checklist which is made up of three parts given to them last October 2009. Part one was about the respondents personal data, part two was the list of 15 new developments inside the school campus and the last part were 10 questions in the level of perceived effects of the new developments. This totaled to a 25-item validated questions made by the researchers as research instruments. The data were computed and analyzed using weighted mean as statistical treatment. The study showed that JBLEFMU- Molo business students were aware about the school development
