Abstract

The main purpose of the study was to determine the level of self-esteem among the 91 randomly selected College of Business students under probationary status during the First Semester of School Year 2010-2011. This study used the descriptive survey research method. The study discovered that the students who are under probationary status when taken as an entire group and even when grouped according to gender and year level have moderate level of self-esteem. When grouped according to courses, the BSMIT has low self-esteem while the BSCSM, BST, and BSBA have moderate self esteem. There is no significant difference in the level of self-esteem among the College of Business students under probationary status when grouped according to gender, year level, and course.
