THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE EXTENT OF EXTRA CURRICULAR  
ACTIVITIES INVOLVEMENT AND STUDY HABITS AMONG  
BSCA STUDENTS

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*Abstract*

The study aimed to determine the relationship between the extent of extra curricular activities involvement and study habits among Bachelor of Science in Customs Administration students at John B. Lacson Foundation Maritime University-Molo during the second semester of School Year 2007-2008.

The participants of this study were the 121 randomly selected BSCA students, from 2<sup>nd</sup> year to 4<sup>th</sup> year, of the Business Department. Data were obtained by a questionnaire checklist developed and validated by the researchers.

Descriptive statistics employed were the means, standard deviations and One-way ANOVA. Inferential statistics employed was the Pearson's r. Significance level was set at .05 alpha. The findings of the study revealed that the BSCA students were "very satisfactory" in their study habits when classified as an entire group, and they were "excellent" in their study habits when classified according to extra curricular activities involvement. No significant

[ differences existed in the level of study habits when  
classified according to extra curricular activities  
involvement. Positive but not significant relationship  
existed between the extent of extra curricular activities  
involvement and the study habits among BSCA students. ]

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
