Abstract

This descriptive research study conducted in November 2006 aimed to determine the temperament and values orientation of 52 randomly selected Bachelor of Science in Cruise Ship Management students for the school year 2006-2007 as an entire group and classified as to sex and high origin. The Keirseay Temperament Sorter (<http://www.edupsych.com>) to determine temperament and Rokeach values Survey (RVS) (Rokeach & Regan, 1980) to determine values orientation of students were the data gathering instruments used. Mean and standard deviation were used as statistical tool for descriptive data analysis and for inferential data analysis t-test for independent samples and Pearson's r set at .05 alphas were utilized. Results of the study showed that the students as an entire group and classified as to sex and those from the private high school were found to be *extravert, sensor, thinker, perceiver* (ESTP) in temperament.

However, students from the public high school were found to be introvert, sensor, feeler, and perceiver (ISFP). A good values orientation was noted also among the students. Results further revealed that there is no significant difference in the third year BSCSM students' temperament and values orientation as revealed in the study.
